The 2018 fiscal year was another strong year for the hospital. Through our efforts to be excellent financial stewards, we attained \$1.5 million in savings by implementing a LEAN/Six Sigma financial change initiative. The management team and employees of the hospital are a major reason for this success.

Our continued focus on improving the patient experience was reinforced by the hospital receiving national recognition and a \$7,000 award from the Hospital Improvement Innovation Network (HIIN), for superior improvement in a nationwide effort to reduce preventable hospital-acquired conditions and readmission.



As we expanded our reach and developed partnerships to better serve our communities, we added exciting new technology and services. In the Surgery Center we added Arthrex, an endoscopic 4K camera technology and Mako Robotic-Assisted Technology, which is the first robot for the hospital. This new technology, along with our partnership with Orthopedic Associates, allows us to offer an innovative option for joint replacement surgery. Additionally, we began offering stem cell orthopedic procedures, which is an alternative to joint surgery, at a substantial cost savings to the patient. Dr. Kara Schultz also performed the hospital's first LINX laparoscopic procedure to treat patients with Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD).

Wayne HealthCare is fully committed to leading the charge in our community's health, but we cannot do it alone. We have immense gratitude for the dedication of our partners involved in the effort to make us a healthcare destination and look forward to creating a healthier community and a healthier you!

Platelet Rich Plasma Procedure – Commonly Called "Stem Cell" Orthopedic Procedure

An alternative to joint surgery, Platelet Rich Plasma (PRP) procedure involves injecting concentrated platelets from the patient's own blood into damaged tissue to help reduce pain and aid in healing. Common orthopedic applications include joint pain, chronic tendon and ligament conditions, and other soft tissue injuries.



How Mako Technology Works

Mako Robotic-Arm Assisted Technology provides you with a personalized surgical plan based on your unique anatomy. A CT scan of the diseased knee joint is uploaded into the Mako System software, where a 3D model of your knee is created. This 3D model is used to pre-plan and assist your surgeon in performing your partial or total knee replacement.

Your surgeon follows your personalized surgical plan, guiding the robotic-arm to remove diseased bone and cartilage and position the implant in the knee joint. The Mako System helps the surgeon stay within the pre-defined areas and provides more accurate placement and alignment of your implant. The robotic-arm does not move without the surgeon's guidance and adjustments can be made to your surgical plan as needed.

In 2018, the 4 Miles for Heart & Health event hosted 171 runners and helped raise close to \$13,000.

Vascular Screening Program

In 2018, a new event, Heart Art, featuring Drab to Fab, was added to our special "Pump Month" to assist with funds for discounted vascular screenings. This event, as well as 4 Miles for Heart & Health, allowed us to serve 337 patients with screenings offering a savings of \$9,860 provided by the Foundation to promote wellness and community heart health. This allows the hospital to offer community members a 3-part vascular ultrasound to check for risks of possible cardiac issues at a discounted rate of only \$25 out of pocket. The Wayne HealthCare Foundation covers the remaining \$25/community member. Thank you to all the participants and donors who made this possible.

Wayne HealthCare is Dedicated to Raising Awareness and Funds to Help Make Screenings More Accessible in the Hope of Saving Lives

Since 2016, when the inaugural 4 Miles for Heart & Health event was held and discounted Vascular Screenings were offered, 721 individuals have received screenings with a savings of \$18,154. 30% of those screened have had reports that have come back with a need for follow-up. That is 1 in 3 community members. It's all about early detection and healthy hearts!




At the Heart of It All

Providing Compression Garments for Local Cancer Patients Who Cannot Afford Them



Growing Together to Advance Your **HEALTHCARE**

Since the hospital opened its doors in 1922, it quickly became a landmark in the local community, rooted in strong service and dedicated to healthcare excellence. For nearly 100 years, we have remained steadfast in our mission to provide quality care and wellness close to home.

Throughout its early years, the hospital witnessed numerous additions, evolving alongside the community as it has grown and needs have changed. The first major addition was completed in 1930 and subsequent additions were finished in 1941, 1957, 1971 and 1973.

Recent Development

Over the past decade, the hospital has continued to undergo significant development in order to provide new and expanded services and improve the patient experience. This includes enhancements in 2010 and 2017, as well as a large facility expansion that is currently underway. Before these enhancements, the hospital was 140,000 sq. ft. When the current expansion is complete, our facility will be 300,000 sq. ft.

Although the size and cost of these construction projects is impressive, that is not what makes them so important. What's important is that it enables us to provide the community with local access to world-class care.

We have one goal that drives us - to move your healthcare and our community forward.






2010

A \$47 million addition was completed in 2010. The 98,000 sq. ft. facility included a new Surgical Center, an Emergency Department and an Imaging / Cardiopulmonary Center.



2017

A \$1.7 million Senior Behavioral Health Unit was added on the 2nd floor of the hospital. The first patient was accepted into the 12-bed, 8,400 sq. ft., secured unit in 2017.



Future Plans

Plans are in place for a future project that will incorporate a 36,000 sq. ft. Medical Office Building to support employed and independent physicians with direct access to hospital diagnostics. No timeline has been established.



2021

Completion of a \$56 million expansion project is expected in 2021. The 85,000 sq. ft. facility will include a Birthing Center, a Wellness Center, an Inpatient Unit, expanded materials management and renovations to existing hospital spaces.

A Destination for Healthcare Needs

Facility Expansion Project

In May 2019, Wayne HealthCare broke ground on a \$56 million expansion project that will add approximately 85,000 sq. ft. to the existing hospital and will include a three-story addition to house a Birthing Center, a Wellness Center, a 32-bed Inpatient Unit with private rooms and expanded materials management space. Renovations will also be performed on the existing hospital to accommodate




an imaging center, a cardiopulmonary center and a stress center. The anticipated opening date for the addition is December 2020 and completion of renovations is expected in April 2021.
