We collaborated with Premier Health to bring Epic Community Connect to our organization, which places us on the leading electronic healthcare platform in the country.

Additional notable achievements included:

- Successful Implementation of Systems Upgrades:
 - o Infor-financial, supply chain and compliance management software
 - o Epic-electronic health record system integrated across hospital and physician offices
- **Lab Services Transition:** The transition of lab services to Compunet was completed.
- Regulatory and Accreditation Achievements:
 - o Passed the Ohio Department of Health survey for maternity services.
 - o Earned high marks from the Commission on Cancer accreditation survey, led by Dr. Reiss, MD, FACS and Jill Brown, reflecting excellence in cancer care.
- Medical Imaging Advances:
 - o Invested in a new nuclear medicine camera.
 - o Added SAVI SCOUT, a cutting-edge radar localization technology for breast cancer surgery, that offers a minimally-invasive alternative to traditional wire localization.
- OB/GYN Department: Welcomed J. Scott Bembry, MD, FACOG and Alaine Kirby, APRN, MSN, FNP to the team, strengthening the practice.
- Cardiology: Launched the first hospital-owned cardiology practice with Dr. Dulin, MD, FACC, which quickly gained traction, and the addition of Brandon Beyke, PA-C.
- Orthopedics: The orthopedic surgery joint venture with OA and HCFP began in May, exceeding projections and demonstrating strong growth potential.

These achievements highlight significant strides in operational efficiency, service quality, and departmental growth throughout the year.



Monday, January 23 was a day of great celebration at Wayne HealthCare as **Dr. Chad Weber, DO, FAOAO, specialist in trauma, orthopedic, and robotic-assisted surgery, completed his 1000th procedure using Mako SmartRobotics.™** Larry Roll, an active, life-long member of the Versailles community, was lucky patient number 1000.

Wayne HealthCare was the first hospital in the region to use Stryker Mako robotic-arm assisted technology for joint replacements in 2018. Mako is currently being used on total hips, total knees, and partial knees with plans for expanding the program to allow for other types of joint surgery in the future.

Through a successful partnership with Orthopedic Associates, Wayne HealthCare has become the **first-choice destination for orthopedics and joint replacement** by bringing together innovative technology, leading-edge treatment and quality, patient-centered care in our first-class facility. Future Physicians

Wright State University Rural Family Medicine Residency Program

Wayne HealthCare along with Family Health have partnered with Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine to be sites in the Rural Family Medicine Residency Program. The program is a 1+2 Rural Training Pathway (RTP). Resident rotations in the first year are held in Dayton, and rotations in the second and third years will be in Greenville.

In February, we welcomed nine Family Medicine Rural Resident candidates, including three which were selected for the program, to Wayne HealthCare and provided them with a tour of the facility and an opportunity to engage with our medical staff.

Wayne HealthCare is eager to become a teaching hospital and help shape future medical leaders by providing one-on-one mentorship and facilitating relationships with patients, our staff, and the community. Wayne HealthCare's first Resident Physician is expected in July 2024.

AED Program

In partnership with Midmark Corporation, Spirit Medical Emergency Services and Greenville Rotary Club, the Wayne HealthCare Foundation provides the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Program to local nonprofit organizations in our community. Nonprofits are able to apply for the grant program to have an AED at their facility to help save lives in a cardiac emergency. A maintenance program is also available for safe and timely replacement of pads and batteries. Midmark is the main corporate donor and Spirit provides CPR/AED training and certification for the nonprofit staff and volunteers.

Vascular Screening Program

Wayne HealthCare Foundation's Vascular Screening Program provides non-invasive, vascular ultrasounds to help **identify risks that could lead to a future stroke or heart attack**. The three-part ultrasound checks the carotid artery, aorta and peripheral (leg) arteries. The purpose of these preventative tests is to catch cardiac issues early and inform patients if they need follow-up care with their medical provider or a cardiologist.

Through our discounted program, we are able to provide \$50 vascular screenings for just \$25.

Since the program's inception in 2016, a total of 2,738 discounted or free screenings have been provided, offering a savings of \$75,774 to our community members. On average, 1 in 3 patients have a result that shows a need for follow-up care.

The Foundation's goal is to change outcomes for the better and ultimately save lives.

All screenings are self-directed and do not require a physician's order.



August 22 marked the anniversary of the tragic loss of Bob Menke, a beloved husband, father, son and brother. He was an engineer at Midmark and an avid runner. He returned home from a run with his daughter Lauren, who was preparing for cross country season, and collapsed from an unknown blockage. He passed away at the age of 38.

Since his passing, the Menke family has taken an active and vital role in our community to help prevent heart disease. In 2016, the Menke family partnered with the Wayne HealthCare Foundation and Midmark to establish the Vascular Screening Program and set up an annual 4 Miles for Heart & Health running event to help raise funding.



A Strong Future

Critical Access Hospital Designation

Like most healthcare organizations, Wayne HealthCare faced significant challenges after the COVID-19 pandemic, namely financial pressures and increasing operational costs.

Through the strategic foresight of our leadership team, a conversation was started in 2022 about becoming a Critical Access Hospital (CAH), which would provide financial stability and pave the way for advanced services.

Critical Access Hospital (CAH) is a designation given to rural hospitals by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

This designation was created by Congress through the Balanced Budget Act of 1997 in response to a string of hospital closures in the 1980s and early 1990s.

The CAH designation is designed to reduce the financial vulnerability of rural hospitals and improve access to healthcare by keeping essential services in rural communities. Critical Access status offers a myriad of benefits, including:

- **Higher Medicare Reimbursements** Provides cost-based reimbursement for services provided to Medicare patients
- **340B Pharmacy Program Eligibility** Significantly reduces medication costs for the hospital and patients
- Skilled Nursing Services under the Swing Bed Program Allows the hospital to provide transitional care without transferring patients to long-term care facilities

In order to be eligible for CAH designation, hospitals must: have 25 or fewer acute care inpatient beds, maintain an average stay under 96 hours for acute care patients, be located more than 35 miles from another hospital, and provide 24/7 emergency care services. Fortunately, these criteria align well with Wayne HealthCare's current operations and will require minimal changes.

In 2023, Wayne HealthCare started to lay the ground work to become eligible for CAH status. It was a rigorous journey—from many meetings with other Ohio critical access hospitals, financial consultants, the hospital accreditation agency, and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), to CMS's redefinition of a primary road that opened our doors to eligibilty, to the board's crucial approval.

The perserverance, teamwork and resilient spirit shown by our staff this year reflects our dedication to adapting to healthcare's dynamic nature and our commitment to the communities we serve. As we move into 2024, we remain focused on our journey towards receiving CAH accreditation to secure a strong and stable future, and continuing to provide quality care for our community, close to home.

This transition isn't just a change-it's a charge towards a vibrant future for Wayne HealthCare.

Patients will have access to the latest in advanced technology including Mako robotic-arm assisted surgery allowing our surgeons to perform joint replacement surgery with outstanding accuracy and alignment. According to clinical studies, this technique allows most people to recover faster with less pain.

Additionally, the OCE will provide a seamless patient experience by offering a full range of orthopedic services, from diagnostic testing, surgical and non-surgical treatment options, to rehabilitation and therapy, all in one place.
